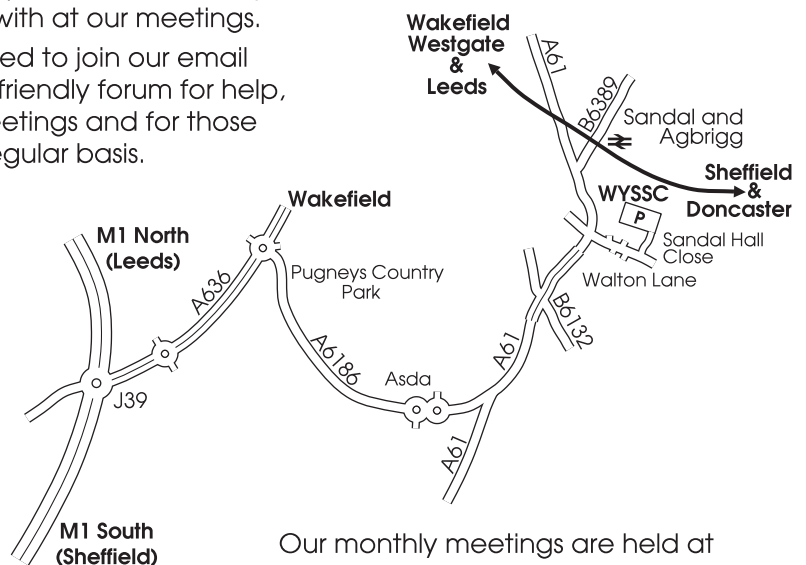
Membership is £15 per year (with an introductory price of just £7.50 in the first year).

In 1996 we organised the first Wakefield Acorn Spring Show. Since then, the Wakefield RISC OS Computer Show has become firmly established in the platform's calendar.
